With an uncertain economic climate still impacting on all our everyday lives and with so many ongoing changes happening all around us, it is particularly pleasing for us to see a 12.6% increase on our overall enrolments in comparison with the same time last year.



Alongside of this our College examination results have also seen an upward trend - with the average pass rate for GCSE

subjects increasing from an already high 96.4% last year to 98.6% this year; whilst our 'A' level average pass rate moving from 82% to 89%; together with many other successes across a range of subject areas.

For the College therefore, a very positive start to this new academic year – and we now want you to be a part of our next year's success stories. Thank you for joining Adult Education College Bexley - let me wish you a successful and enjoyable learning-year ahead.

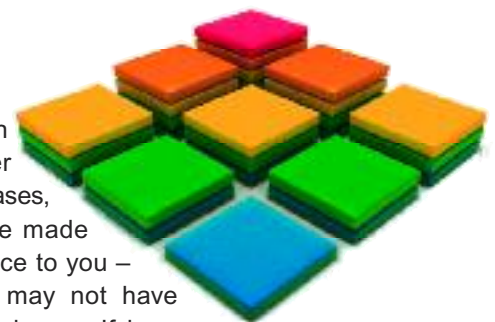
College Restructure

In common with all other adult learning providers, we have been subject to ongoing funding reductions and have had to face a reduction of just under 10% this year. This in turn has led to the College needing to review and revise all of its operational functions... and to restructure.

A major part of our restructure has already taken place with a revised curriculum management structure headed by two Heads of Department, together with a number of other changes; and the discontinuation of two of our three satellite centres at Howbury and Palm

Avenue.

Hopefully in the greater majority of cases, this will have made little difference to you – in fact you may not have noticed any change. If however you have been affected by any changes, we hope you will at least appreciate the context and see unavoidable need for them.
